- <u>Hatch Female Founders Accelerator</u>: Offers up to £1,000 in grants, plus business coaching for early-stage female entrepreneurs.
- <u>Creative UK Female Founders Programme</u>: A six-month initiative by British Business Bank for women-led businesses in creative industries.
- <u>NWEW Accelerator Programme</u>: Provides resources and mentorship for female founders before pitching to investors (applications close 30 April 2025).
- WE Innovate (Imperial Enterprise Lab): A pre-accelerator program offering mentorship and support for female entrepreneurs.
